Mr. Gavin will be discussing the crisis of electronic mediation in the public commons and how his public projects reclaim art production as social and creative activity for children and adults. He will discuss how his work may contribute to an emerging "pattern language" for interactive environments. He will show existing river work along with drawings and models for a variety of proposed devices, studio furniture, vehicles and a flagship retail store / studio / cafe.
