

The program requires of its students an academically rigorous level of commitment and participation. The year-round course is long (four years of evening classes), and intense (two or three courses each quarter). It strives to create an educational environment which fosters an attitude of sensitivity; it supports an ethic which engenders responsibility to the land and environment, concern for human factors, and an overall commitment to significant aesthetic value.

The program encourages students to understand traditional values and methodologies and, at the same time, to value the search for fresh solutions to contemporary problems. Our particular location in a large urban center affords us unique opportunities to observe and participate firsthand in the critical processes of the profession. Daily exposure to every facet of design—from avant-garde to historical preservation, and from single residential to whole new communities—provides a rich study palette for students in this program.

Since a majority of our instructors are involved professionally in these design efforts, students frequently have the opportunity to participate in those projects and to test theories advanced in studio classes against real-world models. The program challenges students to seek more effective ways to address such problems through the application and development of theory and technology. It is dedicated to developing a professional attitude which embraces both constraints and opportunities and optimally satisfies their combined challenges.
