These and other questions will be addressed in Mr. Fischer's talk.

Tom Fischer got his start in book publishing at the University of Chicago Press and Beacon Press. Before moving to Portland in 2004, he spent 14 years on the editorial staff of *Horticulture* magazine in Boston, Massachusetts.

Tom's experiences as a bi-coastal gardener and his inexhaustible curiosity about plants have shaped his new garden, which in 2008 was profiled in the *Oregonian*. A prolific writer as well as an editor, his articles have been featured in magazines such as *Garden Design, Gardens Illustrated*, and *Martha Stewart Living*. His book, *Perennial Companions: 100 Dazzling Plant Combinations for Every Season*, was published by Timber Press in February, 2009. His website, www.Overplanted.com is due to launch in mid-2009.
